Sub:- 2nd Dose vaccination of beneficiaries in Govt. CVCs, who have already been vaccinated with 1st dose in Private CVCs prior to 1st May 2021- Reg.

Ref:- D.O. No: 2088847/2021/Imm dated, 1st May, 2021 of the Govt. of India, Ministry of Health & FW

Madam/Sir,

With reference to the subject & reference cited above, I am to say that the phase 3 vaccination drive commenced from 1st May, 2021 and all citizens aged 18 years & above are eligible for COVID-19 vaccination. MoHFW have already ceased the supply of vaccines to Private CVCs for the vaccination in private CVCs from 1st May 2021. As a result there will be certain numbers of beneficiaries who had received their 1st dose at private CVCs, but were yet to complete the two dose vaccination schedule.

In this regard, it is informed that all such beneficiaries (HCWs/FLWs/45 years & above citizens) who had taken 1st dose at a private CVC on or before 30th April 2021 will be eligible to receive 2nd dose at Govt. CVCs free of cost using Govt. of India supplies. They can also avail 2nd dose in Private CVCs being run under the "Other than Govt. of India channel" on payment basis at the rate fixed by such private CVC.

You are, requested, to follow the above instruction in your district and plan vaccination sessions accordingly.

This has to be treated as "**MOST URGENT**".

Dear All,

The world's largest COVID-19 vaccination drive has been ongoing across all States and UTs from 16th January wherein, around 15.5 crore doses of COVID-19 have been administered. The vaccination drive has now entered its third phase from 1st May 2021 wherein all citizens aged 18 years and above are eligible for vaccination. This phase is being guided by the Liberalised Pricing and Accelerated National Covid-19 Vaccination Strategy.

As part of the liberalized strategy, 50% of the monthly vaccine releases are earmarked for 'Other than Government of India channel' through which State/UT governments, Private hospitals and Hospitals of Industrial Establishments can procure the vaccines directly for persons aged ≥ 18 years. Consequently, the dispensation where private Covid vaccination centres received doses from Govt. and charged up to Rs.250 per dose has now ceased to exist. As a result, there will be certain number of beneficiaries who had received their 1st dose at Private CVCs but were yet to complete the two-dose vaccination schedule.

In this regard, it is informed that all such beneficiaries falling in the Priority group of Health Care Workers (HCWs), Front Line Workers (FLWs) and persons aged ≥ 45 years who had taken their 1st dose at a private CVC on or before 30th April 2021 will be eligible to receive their 2nd dose at Government CVCs free of cost using the Government of India supplies. They can also avail 2nd dose in the private CVC being run under the 'Other than Govt. of India channel' on payment basis at the rate fixed by such private CVC.

I request you to kindly direct the concerned officials to undertake necessary action for completion of immunization schedule of beneficiaries as detailed above. I look forward to your continuous guidance to the ongoing COVID-19 vaccination drive in your State/UT so as to achieve the desired reductions in mortality and morbidity due to COVID-19.
