Sub: Priority vaccination of 2nd dose due beneficiaries of HCWs, FLWs and citizens aged 18 years & above – Reg.

Madam/Sir,

With reference with subject & reference cited above, I am to say that COVID-19 vaccination started from 16th January 2021 with vaccination of Health Care Workers and later on expanded for vaccination of Front Line Workers, Citizens above 60 years, citizens above 45 year and citizens 18 years & above.

Govt. of India vide D.O. dated 13th May 2021 has revised the schedule for 2nd dose with a stipulated time interval of 12 to 16 weeks after first dose, but the time interval between two doses of Covaxin remains the same i.e. 4 to 6 weeks.

With the analysis of database in Co-WIN portal (9th June 2021), 64,465 numbers of HCWs, 34,893 FLWs and 93,191 citizens in the State, who are already due for 2nd dose vaccination, but yet to be vaccinated. The district wise line list of due beneficiaries is enclosed.

You are therefore requested to use the line list of beneficiaries due for 2nd dose and to track & mobilize them through ASHAs /AWWs/HWs for immediate vaccination. You are also requested to regularly monitor the 2nd dose coverage CVC wise / Block wise for timely vaccination of due beneficiaries. Districts /MCs may plan for on-site vaccination of such drop out beneficiaries on priority at the nearby CVC.

Dear Chief Secretary,

India has been implementing the world's largest COVID-19 vaccination drive since 16th Jan'21 through proactive support of all states/UTs, wherein all citizens aged 18 years and above are being vaccinated.

2. The priority of beneficiaries for COVID-19 vaccination in India has been done based on the available scientific evidence & guidelines proposed by WHO to protect individuals at highest risk of exposure to disease. Accordingly, the vaccination drive in our country has been sequentially expanded with a specific purpose to first cover the prioritized and vulnerable groups that included the Health Care Workers (HCWs) and the Front-Line Workers (FLWs)

3. As on 9th June, 2021 the second dose administered against the registered HCWs is at 56% while for the FLWs it stands at 45%. You would agree that complete vaccination and protection of these priority groups is critical to pandemic response. The States/UTs on regular basis are intimated of 2nd dose coverage and concern has also been raised on this matter by the Empowered Group 5 (EG-5).

4. Under the 'Revised Guidelines for Implementation of National Covid Vaccination Programme, Govt. of India will procure 75% of the total vaccines being produced by the manufacturers, for free supplies to States/UTs for administration to all citizens above 18 years with special focus for the priority groups and the citizens whose second dose is due.

5. Presently, based on the recommendations by National Expert Group on Vaccine Administration for COVID-19 (NEGVAC), the schedule of Covishield vaccine is to administer the 2nd dose at 12-16 weeks' interval (i.e. after 84 days) while two doses of Covaxin are to be administered at an interval of 4-6 weeks. The vaccine doses supplied to the States/UTs, especially for Covaxin may be prioritized for the administration of second doses.

6. I am confident that a critical review of the matter in your State would be crucial to ensure completion of vaccination schedule of these beneficiaries by administration of 2nd doses.
