Sub: Timely vaccination of 2nd Dose Due beneficiaries - COVID-19 Vaccine - Reg.

Madam/Sir,

With reference to the subject & reference cited above, I would like to reiterate that amid the current scenario of rising COVID-19 cases across the State, timely completion of 2 dose schedule is of paramount importance to confer protection on the vulnerable section of our population against COVID-19 infection and to reduce hospitalization as well as mortality. Two doses of COVID-19 vaccine are required to beneficiaries as per recommended interval for protection against the COVID without delay or omission.

In this regards, as per the analysis of vaccination status in CoWIN portal of the State, (as on 21st April), nearly 86,562 beneficiaries of COVISHIELD and 26,430 beneficiaries COVAXIN are due for the 2nd dose after an interval of 6 weeks and 4 weeks of the 1st dose respectively. The District wise 2nd dose due beneficiaries yet to be vaccinated as on date is attached for your reference. The list of due beneficiaries CVC wise is available in DIO -district admin log-in and it shall be shared to each CVC and concerned MO I/C for tracking and follow up of due beneficiaries for 2nd dose vaccination.

I would like to request you to kindly instruct concerned officials to initiate the follow up with due beneficiaries to ensure timely vaccination of 2nd dose as per schedule so that beneficiaries can be protected better.


